Far from the heartless and inhuman monsters we might believe them to be, these women are often victims of a culture of violence and emotional trauma.

In the first biography of Billie Holiday in more than two decades, Paul Alexander—author of heralded lives of Sylvia Plath and J. D. 

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

Portraits of a Life

Billy Dee Williams



A film legend recalls his remarkable life of nearly eight decades—a heralded actor who's played the roles he wanted, from Gale Sayers in *Brian's Song* to Lando in the *Star Wars* universe—unchecked by the racism and typecasting so rife in the mostly all-white industry in which he triumphed.

Billy Dee Williams was born in Harlem in 1937 and grew up in a household of love and sophistication. As a young boy, he made his stage debut working with Lotte Lenya in an Ira Gershwin/Kurt Weill production where Williams ended up feeding Lenya her lines. He studied painting, first at the High School of Music & Art, with fellow student Diahann Carroll, and then at the National Academy of Design, before setting out to pursue acting with Herbert Berghof, Stella Adler, and Sidney Poitier.

His first film role was in *The Last Angry Man*, the great Paul Muni's final film. It was Muni who gave Billy the advice that sent him soaring as an actor, "You can play any character you want to play no matter who you are, no matter the way you look or the color of your skin." And Williams writes, "I wanted to be anyone I wanted to be."

He writes of landing the role of a lifetime: costarring alongside James Caan in *Brian's Song*, the made-for-television movie that was watched by an audience of more than fifty million people. Williams says it was "the kind of interracial love story America needed."

The Casa Verdi in Milan, where retired opera singers were welcomed along with various heteronyms of Fernando Pessoa in their afterlife.

- MICHAEL ONDAATJE: Michael Ondaatje stands as one of our most important living writers. Winner of the Booker Prize, the Golden Man Booker, the Scotiabank Giller Prize, and the Prix Médicis, among other honors, Ondaatje remains a household name and has been a Knopf author for decades. 





("They saw things in me I wanted to see in myself / that's why I let them see me that's why I let them see me / on certain nights in certain lights when the planets / lined up like a string of pearls in the sky and the moon / was the correct hue.") An electric, musical journey, *Rangikura* deftly explores popular culture, lockdowns, politics, toxic masculinity, girlhood, beauty, and loss. Through a stunning examination of Tibble's own pain and with the generational wisdom of her ancestors, this incandescent collection lays bare the darkness and hardship lurking underneath life's ordinary surfaces.







Our Kindred Creatures

How Americans Came to Feel the Way They Do About Animals **Bill Wasik and Monica Murphy**



A compassionate, sweeping history of the transformation in American attitudes toward animals by the best-selling authors of *Rabid*

Over just a few decades at the end of the nineteenth century, the United States underwent a moral revolution on behalf of animals. Before the Civil War, animals' suffering had rarely been discussed; horses pulling carriages and carts were routinely beaten in public view, and dogs were pitted against each other for entertainment and gambling. But in 1866, a group of activists began a dramatic campaign to change the nation's laws and norms, and by the century's end, most Americans had adopted a very different way of thinking and feeling about the animals in their midst.

In *Our Kindred Creatures*, Bill Wasik, editorial director of *The New York Times Magazine*, and veterinarian Monica Murphy offer a fascinating history of this crusade and the battles it sparked in American life. On the side of reform were such leaders as George Angell, the inspirational head of Massachusetts's animal-welfare society and the American publisher of the novel *Black Beauty*; Henry Bergh, founder of the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals; Caroline White of Philadelphia, who fought against medical experiments that used live animals; and many more, including some of the nation's earliest veterinarians and conservationists. Caught in the movement's crosshairs were transformational figures in their own right: animal impresarios such as P. T. Barnum, industrial meat barons such as Philip D. Armour, and the nation's rising medical establishment, all of whom put forward their own, very different sets of modern norms about how animals should be treated.

In recounting this remarkable period of moral transition—which, by the turn of the twentieth century, would give birth to the attitudes we hold toward animals today—Wasik and Murphy challenge us to consider the obligations we still have to all our kindred creatures.

The ASPCA, for example, boasts more than 2 million members nationwide, while PETA reports more than 9 million supporters globally. It's estimated that roughly 85 million families include a pet. Recently, *The Washington Post* reported that fashion brands such as Gucci and Calvin Klein have gone fur-free, while demand for meatless burgers skyrockets. Well-known animal rights-advocates include Joaquin Phoenix, Paul and Stella McCartney, Bill Maher, and P!nk.

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





Eventually, he was able to qualify for flight school. After marriage, and with the war on, the young officer and his bride crisscrossed the country, airfield to airfield, base to base: Santa Ana, Yuma, Kissimmee, Bakersfield, Orlando, La Junta, Fresno. He volunteered for night fighters and the newly arrived and almost mythic Black Widow. A world away, the carnage continued. As Paul Hendrickson tracks his parents' journey, together and separate, both stateside and overseas, he creates a vivid portrait of a hard-to-know father whose time in the war, he comes to understand, was something truly heroic, but never without its hidden and unhidden psychic costs.

Bringing to life an iconic moment of American history, and the tragedy of all wars, *Fighting the Night* is an intense and powerful story of violence and love, forgiveness and loss. 

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

The Upside of Every Downturn in Business and in Life **Ken Chenault**



The life and times—and values and principles—of Ken Chenault, former CEO of American Express, one of the first African Americans to head a Fortune 500 company

Ken Chenault's life confounds stereotypical presumptions about and expectations for a Black American man. Born in Mineola, New York, to a dentist and a hygienist as the civil rights movement began to gather steam, much of his childhood and early adult years unfolded in a modest middle-class setting during the political and social tumult of the 1960s—the Vietnam War, the struggle for racial equality, the fight for women's rights, the rise of the counterculture.

Though he was partly informed by these inescapable influences, even then, Chenault displayed an independence of thought. Although he was athletically gifted, he chose to become a student of history, rather than pursue sports, in an effort to conquer his lack of discipline. As a student at Bowdoin and Harvard Law, and early in his career at Bain & Company, he was constantly on the lookout for educational and professional opportunities that were rare for Blacks. Intending to use his talents to champion civil rights, he found himself fighting to demolish the seemingly intractable racial barriers in the worlds of finance and business.

So began his storied career at American Express, where he became known for his innovations and zealous adherence to company-building values and principles: the promotion of empathy to enlarge our understanding of one another; the willingness to accept complexity and uncertainty in crafting solutions, while refusing to yield to despair; and encouragement of unfettered but responsible creativity.

- THE LEADER: Chenault's celebrity and connections are nonpareil. Upon Chenault's retirement from American Express in 2018, Warren Buffett, the company's largest shareholder, stated, "Ken's been the gold standard for corporate leadership and the benchmark that I measure others against." Chenault's leadership prowess was certified by Fortune magazine when it chose him as one of the World's 50 Greatest Leaders.
- SOCIAL AND CIVIC ENGAGEMENTS: To focus exclusively on Chenault's achievements in the business world runs the risk of categorizing him as a *One-Dimensional Man*, giving short shrift to his many social and civic engagements, all of which will amplify his readership. Chenault is a cofounder of One Ten, whose mission is to hire, promote, and advance one million Black individuals who do not have a four-year degree into family-sustaining careers over the next ten years. Chenault serves on the boards of such intensely socially relevant institutions as the Harvard Corporation and Facebook, the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of African American History and Culture Council, the Council on Foreign Relations, and the National September 11 Memorial & Museum.
- PUBLICITY: Chenault is a practiced public speaker and well-connected figure in the media. Our

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

Token Supremacy

The Art of Finance, the Finance of Art, and the Great Crypto Crash of 2022

A *New York Times* investigative reporter wades into the murky, pixelated waters of the multibillion-dollar NFT market—the virtual casino that sprang up overnight in 2020 and came crashing down, with all its celebrity hucksters, just two years later. In 2021, when the gavel fell at Christie's on the sale of Mike Winkelmann's Everydays series—a compilation of five thousand digital artworks—it made a thunderous announcement: Non-fungible tokens had arrived. The ludicrous world of CryptoKitties and Bored Apes had just produced a piece of art worth \$69.3 million (at least according to the highest bidder). On that day, the traditional art market—the largest unregulated market in the world—put its stamp of approval on a very new and carnivalesque digital reality. But what did it mean for these two worlds to collide? Was it all just a money laundering scheme? And come on, what was that piece of digital flotsam really worth anyway?

In *Token Supremacy*, Zachary Small works through these and other fascinating questions, tracing the crypto economy back to its origins in the 2008 financial crisis and the lineage of NFTs back to the first photographic negatives. Small describes jaw-dropping tales of heists, publicity stunts, and rug pulls, before zeroing in on the role of "security tokens" in the FTX scandal. Detours through art history provide insight into the mythmaking tactics that drive stratospheric auction sales and help the wealthy launder their finances (and reputations) through art. And we cast an eye toward the future of NFTs—in mortgages, restaurants, securities, and loans—that could outlive cryptocurrencies, becoming a new and dangerous shadow banking system in its own right.
