

Plastic

A Novel Scott Guild



For fans of *Interior Chinatown* and *American War*, a surreal, hilarious, and sneakily profound debut novel that casts our current climate of gun violence and environmental destruction in a surprising new mold.

Erin is a plastic girl living in a plastic world. Every day she eats a breakfast of boiled chicken, then conveys her articulated body to Tablet Town, where she sells other figurines Smartbodies: wearable tech that allows full, physical immersion in a virtual world, a refuge from real life's brutal wars, oppressive governmental monitoring, and omnipresent eco-terrorist insurgency. If you cut her, she will not bleed—but she and her fellow figurines can still be cracked or blown apart by gunfire or bombs, or crumble away from nuclear fallout. Erin, who's lost her father, sister, and the love of her life, certainly knows plenty about death.

An attack at her place of work brings Erin another too-intimate experience, but it also brings her Jacob: a blind figurine whom she comforts in the aftermath, and with whom she feels an almost instant connection. For the first time in years, Erin begins to experience hope—hope that until now she's only gleaned from watching her favorite TV show, the surrealist retro sitcom "Nuclear Family." Exploring the wild wonders of the virtual reality landscape together, it seems that possibly, slowly, Erin and Jacob may have a chance at healing from their trauma. But then secrets from Erin's family's past begin to invade her carefully constructed reality, and cracks in the facade she's constructed around her life threaten to reveal everything vulnerable beneath.

Both a crypto-comedic dystopian fantasy and a deadly serious dissection of our own farcical pre-apocalypse, Scott Guild's debut novel is an achingly beautiful, disarmingly welcoming, and fabulously inventive look at the hollow core of modern American society—and a guide to how we might reanimate all its broken plastic pieces.

- DYNAMITE DEBUT: As formally inventive and reality-shattering as Charles Yu's best work, yet with a style that's fully and uniquely his own, Scott Guild is blasting onto the scene with a debut like no other. - YOU DON'T KNOW DICK: Philip K., that is. Has there yet been a worthy successor to the trippy sci-fi master (and inspiration for more cult classic SF movies than almost anyone else)? Scott Guild is the one. Plastic reads like The Three Stigmata of Palmer Eldritch -- only gentler and more empathetic.


About the Author/Illustrator

The name Helen Garner commands near-universal acclaim. A master novelist, short-story writer, and journalist, Garner is best known for her frank, unsparing, and intricate portraits of Australian life, often drawn from the pages of her own journals and diaries. Now, in a newly available US edition, comes the disruptive debut that established Garner's masterful and quietly radical literary voice.

Set in Australia in the late 1970s, *Monkey Grip* follows single mother and writer Nora as she navigates the tumultuous cityscape of Melbourne's bohemian underground, often with her young daughter Gracie in tow. When Nora falls in love with the flighty Javo, she becomes snared in the web of his addiction. And as their tenuous relationship disintegrates, Nora struggles to wean herself off a love that feels impossible to live without.

When it first published in 1977, *Monkey Grip* was both a sensation and a lightning rod. While some critics praised the upstart Garner for her craft, many scorned her gritty depictions of the human body and all its muck, her frankness about sex and drugs and the mess of motherhood, and her unabashed use of her own life as inspiration. Today, such criticism feels old-fashioned and glaringly gendered, and *Monkey Grip* is considered a modern masterpiece.

A seminal novel of Australia's turbulent 1970s and all it entailed—communal households, music, friendships, children, love, drugs, and sex—*Monkey Grip* now makes its long-overdue American debut.

- A MODERN CLASSIC: Monkey Grip is both a critical and commercial hit. While it initially received sexist pushback from critics, it is now considered a classic. In 2018, the BBC included it on a list of "100 Books that Shaped the World," among titles like *To Kill a Mockingbird* and 100 Years of Solitude (https://bbc.in/3e5aKgn).
- A GRITTIER GARNER: Whereas Garner's melodic masterpiece *The Children's Bach* follows a suburban family unmoored by the counterculture of the 70s, *Monkey Grip* is written from the center of Melbourne's grungy, bohemian underground—where Garner herself came up as a writer.
- AN EXCITING AMERICAN DEBUT: Text Publishing, Garner's Australian publisher, has only once sold American rights to one of her books (THE SPARE ROOM, to Holt in 2009). This will be part of the first true debut of her acclaimed backlist for American readers.
- A LITERARY DARLING: Despite such little exposure in the US, Garner's acclaim in Australia has
 earned her many fans among literary tastemakers, including James Wood, Rumaan Alam,
 Elizabeth McCracken, Ben Lerner, Kate Atkinson, Julian Barnes, Sarah McNally, and many more.



Meet little Maurice Vellekoop, the youngest of four children raised by Dutch immigrants in the 1970s in a blue-collar suburb of Toronto. Despite their working-class milieu, the Vellekoops are devoted to art, music, and film, and they instill a deep reverence for the arts in young Maurice—except for literature. He'd much rather watch Cher and Carol Burnett on TV than read a book. He also loves playing with his girlfriends' Barbie dolls and helping his Mum in her hair salon, which she runs out of the basement of their house. In short, he is really, really gay. Which is a huge problem, because the family is part of the Christian Reformed Church, a strict Calvinist sect. They go to church twice on Sunday, and they send their kids to a private Christian school, catechism classes, and the Calvinist Cadet Corps. Needless to say, the church is intolerant of homosexuality. Though she loves her son deeply, Maurice's mother, Ann, cannot accept him, setting the course for a long estrangement.

Vellekoop struggles through all of this until he graduates from high school and is accepted into the Ontario College of Art in the early 1980s. Here he finds a welcoming community of bohemians, including a brilliant, flamboyantly gay professor who encourages him to come out. But just as he's dipping his toes into the waters of gay sex and love, a series of romantic disasters, followed by a violent attack, sets him back severely. And then the shadow of the AIDS era descends. Maurice reacts by retreating to the safety of childhood obsessions, and seeks to satisfy his emotional needs with film- and theatre-going, music, boozy self-medication, and prolific art-making. When these tactics inevitably fail, Vellekoop at last embarks on a journey towards his heart's true desire. In psychotherapy, the spiderweb of family, faith, guilt, sexuality, mental health, the intergenerational fallout of World War II, King Ludwig II of Bavaria, French Formula Hairspray, and much more at last begins to untangle. But it's going to be a long, messy, and occasionally hilarious process.

I'm So Glad We Had This Time Together is an enthralling portrait of what it means to be true to yourself, to learn to forgive, and to be an artist.



The Past, Present, and Future of a World-Changing Idea **Leah Hunt-Hendrix and Astra Taylor**



From renowned organizers and activists Leah Hunt-Hendrix and Astra Taylor, comes the first in-depth examination of Solidarity—not just as a rallying cry, but as potent political movement with potential to effect lasting change.

Solidarity is often invoked, but it is rarely analyzed and poorly understood. Here, two leading activists and thinkers survey the past, present, and future of the concept across borders of nation, identity, and class to ask; how can we build solidarity in an era of staggering inequality, polarization, violence, and ecological catastrophe? Offering a lively and lucid history of the idea—from Ancient Rome through the first European and American socialists and labor organizers, to twenty-first century social movements like Occupy Wall Street and Black Lives Matter—Hunt-Hendrix and Taylor trace the philosophical debates and political struggles that have shaped the modern world.

Looking forward, they argue that a clear understanding of how solidarity is built and sustained, and an awareness of how it has been suppressed, is essential to warding off the many crises of our present: right-wing backlash, irreversible climate damage, widespread alienation, loneliness, and despair. Hunt-Hendrix and Taylor insist that solidarity is both a principle and a practice, one that must be cultivated and institutionalized, so that care for the common good becomes the central aim of politics and social life.

- An idea whose time has come: Solidarity—the work of building an egalitarian, sustainable, and multi-racial democracy—as a political theory and a practice is essential to social change yet too often overlooked and misunderstood. It is the driving force behind a wide variety of movements. ranging from labor to Occupy to #metoo to BLM. This book explains its importance, why it's key to a better future, and how best to implement it.
- The first real in-depth study: In comparison to the countless treatises on the evolution and significance of ideas such as justice, liberty, equality, and democracy that make up the canon of Western political thought, there is, remarkably, no book-length examination of the concept of solidarity. This will be the first to truly give the subject it's due.
- Activists with a palpable/quantifiable track: Astra's post Occupy work on debt abolition helped directly inspire the Biden administration's decision to cancel student loan debt for 40 million borrowers and Leah's work with Way to Win was instrumental in flipping Georgia and Arizona senate seats in 2020, in holding the Senate in 2022, and in fending off an array of election-denier Secretary of State candidates.
- Excellent Media Relationships: A New Yorker profile of Leah is already in the works that will drop in advance of publication. She has written for The New Republic, Huffington Post, and Politico; and has been profiled by Salon, Avenue Magazine, and San Francisco Magazine—with numerous other requests pending. Astra's writing has appeared in the New York Times, the Washington Post, n+1, The Nation, and The Baffler, among other venues.

LEAH HUNT-HENDRIX was born and raised in New York City. She has a PhD in Religion, Ethics, and Politics from Princeton University where she wrote her dissertation on the Ethics of Solidarity. Leah has founded multiple organizations that have impacted the American politicallandscape. In 2012, she co-founded Solidaire, a national network of philanthropists dedicated to funding progressive movements, and in 2017, she co-founded Way to Win, a network with a similar structure, this time dedicated to electoral strategy. Both organizations are grounded in building solidarity between major donors and grassroots organizing.

ASTRA TAYLOR is cofounder of the Debt Collective, a union of debtors. She is the director of numerous documentaries and the author of The Age of Insecurity: Coming Together as Things Fall Apart, Democracy May Not Exist But We'll Miss It When It's Gone, and The People's Platform (winner of an American Book Award), among other works. Her writing has appeared in periodicals including The New Yorker, The New York Times, n+1, and The Baffler. She is an advisor to Lux Magazine and is on the editorial board of Hammer & Hope. She was the 2023 CBC Massey Lecturer.



Mother Island

A Daughter Claims Puerto Rico Jamie Figueroa



A searing and deeply personal memoir that explores the institutions—family, society, country—that defined a Puerto Rican woman and what she unlearned to rediscover herself

Growing up in the Midwest, raised by a Puerto Rican mother who was abandoned by her family, Jamie Figueroa and her sisters were estranged from their culture, consumed by the whiteness that surrounded them. In Mother Island, Figueroa traces her search for identity as shaped by and against a mother who settled into the safety of assimilation. In lyrical, blistering prose, Figueroa recalls a childhood in Ohio in which she was relegated to the background of her mother's string of failed marriages; her own marriage in her early twenties to a man twice her age; how her work as a licensed massage therapist helped her heal her body trauma; and how becoming a mother has reshaped her relationship to her family and herself. Only as an adult in New Mexico was Figueroa able to forge her own path, using writing to recast her origin story. In a journey that takes her to Puerto Rico and back, Figueroa looks to her ancestors to reimagine her relationship to the past and to her mother's native island, reaching beyond her own mother into a greater experience of mothering and claiming herself.

In stunning prose that draws from Puerto Rican folklore and mythology, a literary lineage of women writers of color, and narratives of identity, Figueroa presents a cultural coming-of-age story. Candid and raw, Mother Island gets to the heart of the question: Who do we become when we are no longer trying to be someone else?

- CULTURAL FLASHPOINT: Puerto Rico has experienced mass protests, environmental disaster and political uncertainty over the past years, sparking public attention and media interest in the political future of the nation. Mother Island adds to this conversation, exploring the impact of U.S. imperialism on Puerto Rico through a deeply personal lens.
- ADDING TO THE PUERTO RICAN LITERARY CANON: Beyond Esmeralda Santiago, there have been few mainstream works of personal or cultural commentary on the Puerto Rican identity, from Puerto Rican writers, despite the fact that as a nation and now a U.S. colony, the country's history lends itself to rich commentary on American imperialism and multiculturalism. As an Afro-Latina Puerto Rican woman who grew up in the Midwest, Figueroa shares a unique perspective on Puerto Rican and American identity and their intersections.
- HIGHLY-REGARDED WRITER: Figueroa's debut novel was called "beautifully crafted" by the New York Times and "spellbinding" in a starred Publishers Weekly review, and was shortlisted for the Center for Fiction Prize. She has received a Truman Capote Award and was a Bread Loaf scholar.



A richly imaginative reinvention of myth, *Bunyan and Henry* is at once a timeless quest, a fresh origin story, and an urgent modern fable that wrestles with the two sides of the American dream—its wild idealism and cruel underbelly—to inspire the awakening of the folk hero in us all.

- **BUDDY TEAM-UP TIME!**: Great trope or *greatest* trope? Bunyan and Henry seem like unlikely friends at first—they meet as opponents in a prize fight with a *lot* on the line—but soon they discover they have a great deal in common, and can only reach their goals if they work together. (Wow, symbolic!) Their friendship is everything.
- POINTEDLY POLITICAL: Compulsively readable, a rip-roaring adventure, Paul Bunyan and the Beautiful Destiny is also a searing indictment of capitalism run amok. Readers will recognize a certain musk around El Boffo, an entitled attitude that suggests he thinks he has the right to trump anyone who challenges him because of his privilege and wealth. An extremely satisfying comeuppance awaits.
- AWESOMELY OPTIMISTIC: Despite its clear political messages, what really sets Paul Bunyan
 apart and makes it so gripping is its exuberant faith that goodness will prevail. Cecil has tapped into
 the variety of American earnestness that has charmed so many fans of Apple's wildly successful
 Ted Lasso—who, by the way, quips in the first episode of Season 2, "Well boys, I'm more stumped
 than Paul Bunyan's local forest."
- MASCULINE ICONS: Like another TV sensation, HBO Max's Our Flag Means Death, Paul Bunyan also presents an alternative argument for what it means to be a man. Even at their macho axe- and hammer-wielding heights, Bunyan and Henry—literal pillars of American masculinity—are tender counterpoints to prevailing toxic attitudes.
- MYTH MAD: As Adrienne Westenfeld wrote in a recent *Esquire* piece: "mythology's back, baby." Retellings are hugely popular, and *Bunyan* should appeal to fans of Madeline Miller's *Circe* and *The Song of Achilles*, and GennaRose Nethercott's *Thistlefoot*. Uniquely *American* mythology is relatively untapped, though—so here's Cecil not only tapping that tree, but expertly felling it in one clean sweep of his axe.
- WELL-CONNECTED AUTHOR: Part of A Mighty Blaze, Cecil hosts *The Thoughtful Bro*, on which he's interviewed George Saunders, Yaa Gyasi, T.C. Boyle, Maggie O'Farrell, Jeff VanderMeer, Jess Walter, Phil Klay, Nicole Krauss, Jonathan Lethem, and dozens of others who will be excited to support his own authorial endeavors.







Artful Ali Smith

In February 2012, the novelist Ali Smith delivered the Weidenfeld lectures on European comparative literature at St. Anne's College, Oxford. Her lectures took the shape of this set of discursive stories. Refusing to be tied down to either fiction or the essay form, *Artful* is narrated by a character who is haunted—literally—by a former lover, the writer of a series of lectures about art and literature.

A hypnotic dialogue unfolds, a duet between and a meditation on art and storytelling, a book about love, grief, memory, and revitalization. Smith's heady powers as a fiction writer harmonize with her keen perceptions as a reader and critic to form a living thing that reminds us that life and art are never separate.

Artful is a book about the things art can do, the things art is full of, and the quicksilver nature of all artfulness. It glances off artists and writers from Michelangelo through Dickens, then all the way past postmodernity, exploring every form, from ancient cave painting to 1960s cinema musicals. This kaleidoscope opens up new, inventive, elastic insights—on the relation of aesthetic form to the human mind, the ways we build our minds from stories, the bridges art builds between us. Artful is a celebration of literature's worth in and to the world and a meaningful contribution to that worth in itself. There has never been a book quite like it.



In this deeply researched, immersive history, Adam Kuper tells the story of how foreign and prehistoric peoples and cultures were represented in Western museums of anthropology. Kuper tackles difficult questions of repatriation and justice, and how best to ensure that the future of these museums is an ethical, appreciative one that promotes learning and cultural exchange.

A stunning, unique, accessible work based on a lifetime of research, *The Museum of Other People* reckons with the painfully fraught history of museums of natural history, and how curators, anthropologists, and museumgoers alike can move forward alongside these time-honored institutions.







In 1938, a dead whale washes up on the shores of remote Welsh island. For Manod, who has spent her whole life on the island, it feels like both a portent of doom and a symbol of what may lie beyond the island's shores. A young woman living with her father and her sister (to whom she has reluctantly but devotedly become a mother following the death of their own mother years prior). Manod can't shake her welling desire to explore life beyond the beautiful yet blisteringly harsh islands that her hardscrabble family has called home for generations.

The arrival of two English ethnographers who hope to study the island culture, then, feels like a boon to her—both a glimpse of life outside her community and a means of escape. The longer the ethnographers stay, the more she feels herself pulled towards them, reckoning with a sensual awakening inside herself, despite her misgivings that her community is being misconstrued and exoticized.

With shimmering prose tempered by sharp wit, Whale Fall tells the story of what happens when one person's ambitions threaten the fabric of a community, and what can happen when they are realized. O'Connor paints a portrait of a community and a woman on the precipice, forced to confront an outside world that seems to be closing in on them.

- UNIVERSAL THEMES: This is a coming-of-age story that transcends cultures. The tension between the main character's sense of obligation to her family and her mounting desire for independence, the yearning, and the way she grapples with grief and loss are universal and emotionally accessible, despite the fact that Welsh island life isn't particularly recognizable to the American reader.
- GORGEOUS PROSE: O'Connor reads like some of the great contemporary British writers (Barnes, McEwan, Ishiguro) but with a fierce and more rebellious tone. The writing is lush and gorgeous, yet tempered by sharp wit and cultural references.
- ADAPTATION POTENTIAL: There is a vast body of commercially successful and popular film and TV adaptations of British period literature. Whale Fall's complex characters and rich setting make it ripe for film or miniseries adaptation
