

Mondrian His Life, His Art, and the Quest of the Absolute Nicholas Fox Weber

In the early 1920s, surrounded by the roaring streets of avant-garde Paris, Piet Mondrian began creating what would become some of the most recognizable abstract paintings of the 20th century. With rectangles of primary colors against a dazzling white background, this was geometric abstraction in its purest form. These revolutionary compositions exhilarated, intoxicated, confused, and enraged the international public—and changed the course of modern art forever.

Now, for the first time, Mondrian emerges alongside his thrilling art. Here is the life of an elusive modern master: from his youth in a religious household in the Netherlands where he first began painting Dutch farmhouses and sand dunes, to his move to Paris where he embraced the work of Pablo Picasso, Georges Seurat, and Cézanne, to the 1920s and onward where, surviving the turmoil of two world wars and embracing a rapidly shifting culture, Mondrian challenged the concept of art and invented a new world of undiluted colors and rhythmic straight lines. His work would go on to affect painting, architecture, fashion, and design in decades to come.

Here is also an intimate portrait of a complex artist, his solitude and avoidance of intimacy, his eccentricities and his philosophy, his passion for ballroom dancing, and his unwavering belief in art as a vehicle to reveal universal truths.

Griffin Hurt is in over his head. Between his role as Peter Proton on the hit TV show *The Nuclear Family* and the pressure of high school at New York's elite Boyd Prep—along with the increasingly compromising demands of his wrestling coach—he's teetering on the edge of collapse.

Then comes Naomi Shah, twenty-two years Griffin's senior. Unwilling to lay his burdens on his shrink—whom he shares with his father, mother, and younger brother, Oren—Griffin soon finds himself in the back of Naomi's Mercedes sedan, again and again, confessing all to the one person who might do him the most harm.

Less a bildungsroman than a story of miseducation, *Playworld* is a novel of epic proportions, bursting with laughter and heartache. Adam Ross immerses us in the life of Griffin and his loving (yet disintegrating) family while seeming to evoke the entirety of Manhattan and the ethos of an era—with Jimmy Carter on his way out and a B-list celebrity named Ronald Reagan on his way in. Surrounded by adults who embody the age's excesses—and who seem to care little about what their children are up to—Griffin is left to himself to find the line between youth and maturity, dependence and love, acting and truly grappling with life.

He has been a fellow in fiction at the American Academy in Berlin and a Hodder Fellow for Fiction at Princeton University. He is editor of *The Sewanee Review*. Born and raised in New York City, he now lives in Nashville, Tennessee, with his two daughters.



Dr. Oliver Sacks—who describes himself variously in these pages as "a philosophical physician," "an astronomer of the inward," and a "neuropathological Talmudist"— wrote lengthy letters throughout his life: to his parents, his beloved Aunt Lennie, to friends and colleagues from London, Oxford, California, and around the world. These pages begin with his arrival in America as a young man, eager to establish himself away from the confines of postwar England, and carry us through his bumpy early career in medicine and the discovery of his writer's voice and métier; his weightlifting, motorcycle-riding years and his explosive seasons of discovery with the patients who populate his book *Awakenings*; his growing interest in matters of sight and the musical brain; his many friendships and exchanges with fellow writers, artists, and scientists (to say nothing of astronauts, botanists, and mathematicians), and his deep gratitude for all these relationships at the end of his life. Some letters contain the first detailed sketches of an essay forming in his mind; others reveal his agony over a tempestuous love affair or his reminiscences of childhood.

From Francis Crick and Jane Goodall to W. H. Auden and Susan Sontag, from lovers to patients, and ordinary folk who wrote to him with their odd symptoms and questions, all are treated equally to Sacks's lyrical, ferocious, penetrating, and at times hilarious observations.

Sensitively introduced and edited by Kate Edgar, Sacks's longtime editor (and one of his correspondents), the letters deliver a complete portrait of Sacks as he wrestles with the workings of the brain and mind. We see, through his eyes, the beginnings of modern neuroscience as it unlocks many secrets of how the human brain defines us. We experience the arc of a remarkable personal evolution, closely following the thought processes of one of the great intellectuals of our time whose words, as evidenced in these pages, were unfailingly shaped with generosity and wonder toward other people.

His work was frequently published in *The New Yorker* and *The New York Review of Books*, and over the years, he received many awards, including honors from the Guggenheim Foundation, the National Science Foundation, the American Academy of Arts and Letters, the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and the Royal College of Physicians.





The Rising

The Twenty-Year Battle to Rebuild the World Trade Center



The never-before-told inside story of the rebuilding of the World Trade Center — an epic tale of business, politics, and engineering by the man who spent two decades working to make it happen

After the terrorist attacks of 9/11 destroyed the World Trade Center, New Yorkers and Americans faced a critical set of questions: What should be done with the site? Could the towers be replaced? And how best to memorialize those lost on that day? For Larry Silverstein, a lifelong New Yorker who had signed a lease for the properties just a few months before the attacks, the answer was clear: America had to rebuild as quickly as possible.

In *The Rising*, Silverstein recounts in vivid detail his long battle to construct a new World Trade Center complex and to revitalize the surrounding neighborhood while also memorializing the victims of the attacks. Silverstein made history in 2001 when he signed a 99-year lease on the 10.6-million-square-foot World Trade Center for \$3.25 billion. For the next twenty years, he navigated warring political interests, byzantine city bureaucracies, and resistant insurance companies, as well as the many challenges of designing, engineering, and constructing several new towers in the heart of downtown Manhattan. More than once the entire project almost folded, but today the buildings are nearly complete and the neighborhood is once again a thriving hub that draws hundreds of thousands of people a day.


The Rising is a vibrant portrait of the inner workings of New York City in the wake of its most profound tragedy, but it is also a master class in how to succeed in business despite all odds. Full of outsize characters and relentless adversity, this is a riveting book about a remarkable feat of vision and determination.

The First and Last King of Haiti The Rise and Fall of Henry Christophe Marlene L. Daut



The essential biography of the controversial rebel, traitor, and only king of Haiti. Henry Christophe (1767 - 1820) is one of the most richly complex figures in the history of the Americas, and was, in his time, popular and famous the world over: in The First and Last King of Haiti, a brilliant young Yale scholar unravels the still controversial enigma that he was.

Slave, revolutionary, traitor, king, and suicide, Henry Christophe was, in his time, popular and famous the world over. Born to an enslaved mother on the Caribbean island of Grenada, Christophe first fought to overthrow the British in North America, before helping his fellow enslaved Africans in Saint-Domingue, as Haiti was then called, to gain their freedom from France. Yet in an incredible twist of fate, Christophe ended up fighting with Napoleon's forces against the very enslaved men and women he had once fought alongside. Later, reuniting with those he had betrayed, he offered to lead them and made himself their king. But it all came to a sudden and tragic end when Christophe—after thirteen years of his rule as King Henry I—shot himself in the head, some say with a silver bullet.


Why did Christophe turn his back on Toussaint Louverture and the very revolution with which his name is so indelibly associated? How did it come to pass that Christophe found himself accused of participating in the plot to assassinate Haiti's first ruler, Dessalines? What caused Haiti to eventually split into two countries, one ruled by Christophe in the north, who made himself king, the other led by President Pétion in the south?

The First and Last King of Haiti is a riveting story of not only geopolitical clashes on a grand scale but also of friendship and loyalty, treachery and betrayal, heroism and strife in an era of revolutionary upheaval.

- ENDURING IMPORTANCE OF THE HAITIAN REVOLUTION (1791-1804): It was in essence the first Black Lives Matter movement, a series of revolts and rebellions against French imperialism that resulted in the only independent nation created by former slaves in the history of humankind.
- THE ISSUE OF REPARATIONS: What happened to Haiti after the king's suicide informs the ongoing conversation about reparations for slavery: as a recent New York Times series revealed, Haiti was forced to agree to pay France a 150-million-francs indemnity as the price of French recognition of Haitian independence—an outrage that continues to haunt Haiti to this day, the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. Economist Thomas Pikkety argues in his bestselling book Capital in the Twenty-First Century that, adjusted for inflation and interest, France owes Haiti a minimum of 28 billion U.S. dollars, precisely because of what happened after King Henry's death.
- LITERARY INFLUENCE: Like Toussaint Louverture's, Henry Christophe's life has inspired major works of literature by, among other writers, Nobel Prize-winner Derek Walcott, Cuban novelist Alejo Carpentier, and Martinican poet and diplomat Aimé Césaire. Christophe's life also served as the basis for Orson Welles's striking 1936 Broadway adaptation of Shakespeare's Macbeth (Voodoo Macbeth).

MARLENE DAUT is Professor of French and African Diaspora Studies at Yale University. She teaches courses in anglophone, francophone Caribbean, African American, and French Colonial and historical studies. 

Undivided





The story of evangelical leaders in Cincinnati struggling to bridge racial divides in their own church, their community, and across the nation

In one of the largest evangelical megachurches in America, thousands of congregants have participated in a remarkable experiment: Undivided, a six-week program developed by church leaders, designed to cultivate meaningful relationships across race, and to foster antiracism grounded in action. The designers of Undivided recognized that any effort to combat racial injustice had to move beyond addressing only individual prejudice. Change, therefore, would have to be radical—from the very roots—tracing both individual prejudices and the structures that perpetuate them. Hahrie Han, a political science professor at Johns Hopkins University, was given complete and open access to tell the story of their work. In Undivided, she details the program's development, its participants' efforts to navigate the complexities of race and faith during the Trump era, and its effects. Han also addresses the history of the white evangelical movement, including the ongoing contestation over its historic ties to white supremacy and exclusion.


Han's narrative weaves together the accounts of four congregants—two men, one Black and one white; two women, one Black and one white—who participated in Undivided and dedicated themselves to carrying forward the work of constructing racial solidarity. Their journeys were courageous, eye-opening, at times painful, always complex and uncertain—and unfinished.

None of them came away unchanged.

- A POSSIBLE MODEL FOR CHANGE: The author shows us Blacks and whites sitting down together and talking-confronting the reality of their own perceptions and the structure of the world around them. It's a model for other churches and civic groups to contemplate.
- CHURCHGOING AUDIENCE: Half a million people attend services at Crossroads in person or online each week, and the church has more than 1.5 million followers across its social media channels. About 14% of all Americans identify as Evangelical.
- TOPICAL: The author probes the longstanding affiliation between the Evangelical church and the Republican party. Recent elections have been characterized by discussions of racial injustice; that won't change.
- OPTIMISTIC BUT PRAGMATIC: The author's message is one of hope-all the more credible because she avoids platitudes-that churches are capable of providing a productive path forward.

HAHRIE HAN is a professor of political science at Johns Hopkins University, as well as the inaugural director of SNF Agora, an institute dedicated to strengthening global democracy. She writes for The New York Times, The Washington Post, and The New Republic and is the author of four scholarly books. The daughter of Korean immigrants, she lives in Baltimore.







One Lawyer's Fight for Justice in the Wake of America's Great Coal Catastrophe

Jared Sullivan

A riveting courtroom drama as the victims of one of the largest environmental disasters in U.S. history pursue justice in federal court — with the help of a country lawyer determined to challenge the notion that, in America, justice can be bought

For more than 50 years, a power plant in the little town of Kingston, Tennessee, burned fourteen thousand tons of coal a day, gradually creating a mountain of ashen waste 60 feet high and covering 84 acres. On December 22, 2008, an earthen embankment that contained the waste broke, unleashing a lethal wave of coal sludge that covered 300 acres, damaged nearly 30 homes, and precipitated a cleanup effort that would cost more than \$1 billion—and the lives of more than 50 cleanup workers.

Jim Scott, a small-time personal-injury lawyer, agreed to represent the workers after they began to fall ill from having inhaled the toxic coal waste. That meant doing legal battle against the Tennessee Valley Authority, a colossal, federally owned power company that was a cornerstone of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal. Scott and the team he hastily assembled gathered extensive evidence of malfeasance: threats against workers; retaliatory firings; disregarded safety precautions; and test results, either hidden or altered, that would have revealed harmful concentrations of arsenic, lead, and radioactive materials at the cleanup site.


The lawsuit that Scott pursued on the workers' behalf was about their illnesses, no doubt. But it was also about whether blue-collar employees could beat the C-suite; if self-described "hillbilly lawyers" could beat elite corporate defense attorneys; and whether strong evidence could beat fat pocketbooks. Perhaps, above all, the case was simply about whether the federal government had failed its people.



From Dashi Cheese Grits with Honey Miso Butter, Collard Greens and Cabbage Miso Soup with Crispy Bacon, and Fish and Lotus Chips, to Caesar Salad with Aonori Croutons and Bonito Flakes, Shio Koji Marinated Roast Chicken, and Miso Apple Pie, these are recipes that reflect—and celebrate—the multinational, interconnected way in which we all eat today. Sakai also introduces the essential building blocks of Japanese cuisine—dashi, miso, and soy sauce—that can be used to give any dish a wafu twist.

A book that reflects as much the author's own journey—a life spent in New York, Los Angeles, Mexico, and elsewhere—as it does the foods of Japan, *Wafu Cooking* is an utterly unique, thoroughly modern cookbook.

- JAPANESE-ISH: Wafu ("Japanese style") cooking is all about cross-cultural exchange. 
Weaving together the story of her own youth, marked by long afternoons skiing the mountains, a cottage on the lake, and a proud gay brother, but also by neglect and bullying that pushed her brother to the brink, Abi Maxwell contends with the rural America where she was raised and, years later, where she is now raising her daughter, as lawmakers nationwide push to erase the very existence of trans youth. Intimate and stirring, this book is essential reading for this moment in our history.

She is a dedicated advocate for the rights of transgender youth in her state and frequently testifies in front of the legislature on their behalf.






"There can be no history of my body. My forgetfulness is in earnest. I check for it like for keys in a pocket. I've remained a girl all my life."

With searing intelligence and great sensitivity, the poems of Kelly Caldwell—many addressed to Cass Donish, her partner in the years before her suicide at thirty-one, swim through a complex matrix of transformations: mental illness, divorce, gender transition, and self-discovery. But they wrestle, too, with the poet's painful relationships with her family of Christian missionaries, who refused to affirm her identity. In a sequence of "dear c." poems scattered throughout these pages, Caldwell writes letters to her lover from an out-of-state residential hospital where she is receiving treatment for suicidal depression and mania. In a long poem titled "Self-Portrait as Job," she offers us her lucid gaze and her queer take on the biblical figure—an understated yet powerful testament to her own suffering in a society whose structures may not contain her.

Both striking and elusive, both raw and learned, with a delicacy of syntax that challenges us to interrogate becoming itself, Kelly Caldwell asks us from beyond: What kind of fragile agency is at the heart of obliterating change?

- **SUBJECT MATTER:** The prevalence of trans suicide in our country and the struggle of trans people to be recognized, often by their own families, is at the core of Kelly's story.
- **UNIQUE PUBLICATION EVENT:** In conversation with Cass Donish's collection, this book is the other half of an important and moving conversation between gueer lovers.
- **LGBTQ SUPPORT**: Kelly's writing has been championed or chosen for publication by Jos Charles, Andrea Lawlor, and TC Tolbert, among others, and will continue to be supported by both LGBTQ writers and allies.

A trans poet, writer, and visual artist, KELLY CALDWELL was the winner of the Norma Lowry Memorial Prize and the Cornelison English Prize from Washington University in St. Louis, an Academy of American Poets University Prize, and the 2019 Greg Grummer Prize. Her writing has appeared in *Denver Quarterly, Entropy, Fence, Mississippi Review, The Missouri Review, Seneca Review, The Rumpus*, and *VICE*. She was founding editor and co-editor-in-chief of *The Spectacle*. Caldwell died in March 2020. At the time, she was living in Columbia, MO, with her partner, the writer Cass Donish. She was posthumously awarded an honorary PhD in English from Washington University in St. Louis.

Your Dazzling Death Poems Cass Donish



Written in the devastating aftermath of a partner's suicide, this unprecedented collection is a restorative memorial act, an exploration of queer time, and a powerful expression of nonbinary and trans love in the wake of traumatic loss.

Queer writers Cass Donish and Kelly Caldwell were life partners, exploring their evolving gender identities together, writing poems side by side, and navigating Caldwell's severe bipolar disorder until her death by suicide in 2020. In *Your Dazzling Death*, Donish insists that the intimacy of an ongoing conversation with a beloved mysteriously continues after loss; they elegize Caldwell and summon the courage to witness their own state of "obliteration," widowed and isolated as a global pandemic is unfolding.

With searing honesty and profound perceptiveness, Donish finds a fierce new aesthetic for the disorientation of grief. "Let me paint this / entire country / the colors of your face," they write, showing how wildly scale can shift in the midst of loss. Against the backdrop of "anti-trans bills / moving through state legislatures," Donish affirms the beauty of their lover's trans becoming, recalling when they "sounded out / your new potential names / until we found those syllables . . . which tasted, you said, like having / a future." In the sequence "Kelly in Violet," the centerpiece of this collection, the story of Caldwell's death emerges in conversation with the work of Uruguayan poet Marosa di Giorgio, whose words allow Donish to access the shattering event, appearing here in ghostly traces.

Your Dazzling Death memorializes a brilliant woman, ritualizes the work of grief, and subverts linear time, asserting that any shape the future takes will be informed forever by a monumental love that is still alive, not only in the past, but in an envisioned space of timelessness where love and grief are inevitably intertwined.

Their nonfiction chapbook, *On the Mezzanine* (2019), was chosen by Maggie Nelson as winner of the Gold Line Press Chapbook Competition. An interdisciplinary writer, educator, and performer, Donish has writing appearing in *American Poetry Review, Cincinnati Review, Colorado Review, Denver Quarterly, Gettysburg Review, Guernica, Poem-a-Day, Tupelo Quarterly, VICE, and elsewhere.* They have taught creative writing at Washington University in St. Louis, University of Missouri, Kenyon Review Young Writers Workshop, and Ashland University's low-res MFA program. They live in Columbia, Missouri.



There Are Rivers in the Sky A novel Elif Shafak



Sweeping across centuries, and stretching from Mesopotamia to London, this enchanting new novel by a Booker Prize finalist conjures a trio of characters living in the shadow of one of the greatest epic poems of all time.

In the ancient city of Nineveh, on the bank of the River Tigris, King Ashurbanipal of Mesopotamia, erudite but ruthless, built a great library that would crumble with the end of his reign. From its ruins, however, emerged a poem, the Epic of Gilgamesh, that would infuse the existence of two rivers and bind together three lives.

In 1840 London, Arthur is born beside the stinking, sewage-filled River Thames. With an abusive, alcoholic father and a mentally ill mother, Arthur's only chance of escaping destitution is his brilliant memory. When his gift earns him a spot as an apprentice at a leading publisher, Arthur's world opens up far beyond the slums, and one book in particular catches his interest: *Nineveh and Its Remains*.

In 2014 Turkey, Narin, a ten-year-old Yazidi girl, is diagnosed with a rare disorder that will soon cause her to go deaf. Before that happens, her grandmother is determined to baptize her in a sacred Iraqi temple. But with the rising presence of ISIS and the destruction of the family's ancestral lands along the Tigris, Narin is running out of time.


In 2018 London, the newly divorced Zaleekah, a hydrologist, moves into a houseboat on the Thames to escape her husband. Orphaned and raised by her wealthy uncle, Zaleekah had made the decision to take her own life in one month, until a curious book about her homeland changes everything.

A dazzling feat of storytelling, *There Are Rivers in the Sky* entwines these outsiders with a single drop of water, a drop which remanifests across the centuries. Both a source of life and harbinger of death, rivers—the Tigris and the Thames—transcend history, transcend fate: "Water remembers. It is humans who forget."

- AWARDS AND HONORS: The Island of Missing Trees was a Reese Witherspoon Book Club Pick. It was shortlisted for the Costa Novel Award, Women's Prize for Fiction, while 10 Minutes 38 Seconds in This Strange World was shortlisted for the Booker Prize and RSL Ondaatje Prize. This new book is bound for similar treatment.

ELIF SHAFAK is an award-winning British-Turkish author of a dozen novels, including *The Island of Missing Trees*, shortlisted for the Costa Novel Award, and *10 Minutes 38 Seconds in This Strange World*, shortlisted for the Booker Prize. Her work has been translated into fifty-six languages. She holds a PhD in political science and has taught at universities in Turkey, the U.S., and the UK. She lives in London and is an honorary fellow at Oxford University.







Armed with an insider's perspective from his time within the conservative movement, David Brock reveals how the efforts to stack the Court in service of extreme right-wing interests stem from a decades-long strategy to weaponize our judicial system into an extension of the Republican Party itself. *Stench* investigates the ethics scandals that surround Clarence Thomas and his wife, the right-wing activist Ginni Thomas, culling new material from Thomas's accusers, along with original reporting and Brock's firsthand knowledge of the inner workings of the GOP. *Stench* is a staggering exposé, one that only Brock could write—exhaustive in its research and revelatory in its access to the world of what has effectively become the Thomas Court.

Following the 2010 elections, Brock founded the Super PAC American Bridge, which works to elect Democrats. Brock is a *New York Times* best-selling author. 

Passiontide A novel Monique Roffey



When a female musician is found murdered on a small tropical island, after a string of similar deaths, outraged local women take matters into their own hands.

The quiet calm of Ash Wednesday morning. Carnival is over. Everyone on the small island of St. Colibri is sleeping peacefully. Everyone except Sora Tanaka, a young pan player lying under the cannonball tree. Sora, a professional musician, had been visiting St. Colibri to take part in the island's famous steel pan competition. But Sora isn't asleep; she's dead: brutally murdered, and still in her costume. And as the women of this island know all too well, Sora is far from the first woman to be killed, and she probably won't be the last, either. In fact, the problem of women being killed on the island is so bad, there's even a dedicated unit within the police department: OMWEN, the Office for Murdered Women, headed by Inspector Cuthbert Loveday.

In this powerful new rewriting of the detective novel, Sora's death is the last straw and the beginning of something much larger, a "revolution" some are calling it. The event draws together four women who have never before seen each other as allies: a friend of the victim, the organizer of a sex workers' collective, a local activist, and the prime minister's wife. Tenderly, sometimes hilariously, *Passiontide* chronicles how these women join forces and find new ways to help one another.

- **NEW FEMINIST TAKE**: Detective novels often feature male protagonists; the death of a woman is but the spur to their adventures. In this reimagining, the death of Sora Tanaka serves as the beginning of something much larger, as women from across the island come together in an act of mass self-defense.
- **BIG CHARACTERS**: *Passiontide* is driven by Roffey's deep gift for writing characters. Deep, rich, maddening, lovable characters, the women of this book leap off the page in full complexity, and as we get to know them, we come to understand why this moment of resistance has been so long in coming.
- **CARRIBEAN**: Hailed as an author "changing the face of Caribbean literature," and Antillean herself, Roffey provides a sweeping, evocative image of a Caribbean island and society in all its complexity.
- **OFF THE PAGE**: Based on a true story, *Passiontide* is more than a detective novel; it aims to bring to light the prevalence of femicide, an issue of global importance and rampant occurrence in the Caribbean and beyond.
- **COLLECTIVE**: As a teacher, activist, and unique writer who sees her work as part of a collective enterprise, not unlike the characters in this book, Monique Roffey has developed a groundswell of good will, especially among other writers, notable for their support of her last book, including Margaret Atwood, Bernardine Evaristo, Karen Russell, Maggie O'Farrell, and C. Pam Zhang.
- **MOMENTUM**: Roffey is building her audience. Her previous book, *The Mermaid of Black Conch*, was the most award-listed book in the UK in 2020–2021 and won a 2020 Costa Book Award. With its topicality, *Passiontide* is a potential award-winner, too.

MONIQUE ROFFEY is Professor of Contemporary Fiction at Manchester Metropolitan University. She is the author of eight books, five of which are set in Trinidad and the Caribbean region. *The Mermaid of Black Conch*, her previous novel, won the Costa Book of the Year award. She co-founded Writers Rebel inside Extinction Rebellion. She was born in Port of Spain, Trinidad, and lives in the East End of London.





Atwood's last collection, *Dearly* (2020), has sold over 40,000 copies across all formats. With a devoted fanbase—and simply by being a career-spanning Atwood book—we should expect big results.
- **KNOPF POETRY LIST:** Margaret Atwood is one of our most important writers, and with her Knopf debut she joins the ranks of some of our most important poets. Like Mark Strand, Philip Levine, Amy Clampitt, Jack Gilbert, and many of our other great poets, Atwood will be celebrated with a career-spanning project sporting our beloved borzoi.

MARGARET ATWOOD is the author of more than fifty books of fiction, poetry, and critical essays. She has won the Booker Prize, the Arthur C. Clarke Award for Imagination in Service to Society, the Franz Kafka Prize, the Peace Prize of the German Book Trade, the PEN USA Lifetime Achievement Award, and the Dayton Literary Peace Prize. 

Only in America Al Jolson and The Jazz Singer Richard Bernstein



A probing biography of world-renowned Jewish singer and actor Al Jolson and the history of his performance in and the making of *The Jazz Singer*

Al Jolson, born Asa Yoelson, immigrated from a *shtetl* in Lithuania to the United States in 1894 after his father secured a job as a rabbi in Washington, D.C. A poor, Yiddish-speaking newcomer navigating a racially segregated and antisemitic America, young Jolson dreamed of becoming a star, and he did. Thanks to his immense talent and his knack for assimilating into new environments, by the time he reached his twenties he was the most famous and highly paid entertainer in America, making almost \$5,000 a week at a time when the average American made \$800 a year. Jolson's public adoration and widespread acceptance as a star marked the beginning of an enriching cultural transformation, a moment when the American mind opened up to ethnic and racial differences, widening the gap of acceptability. And yet Jolson himself, despite being ferociously ambitious and gigantically talented, was crippled by insecurity, often nervous to the point of collapse, prisoner to his many vices.


Through Jolson, Bernstein simultaneously breaks open the history and legacy of the cultural sensation *The Jazz Singer*. Not only was *The Jazz Singer* the first feature length film with synchronized music and dialogue, but it was also taboo smashing in its content: *The Jazz Singer* is all about Jews, Orthodox and otherwise. Bernstein expounds on the making of *The Jazz Singer*, what the film meant then and now, introducing the many individuals involved in its production, including Samson Raphaelson, a young Jewish writer whose short story was the basis for the movie; the four Warner brothers, who made a fortune off it; and George Jessel, Jolson's rival and the star of Raphaelson's stage adaptation of his short story. In the background emerges a picture of old Hollywood in the Roaring Twenties: cutthroat and greedy yet visionary and progressive. And while *The Jazz Singer* represented the future in many ways, it also dredged up the worst of the past, including Jolson's use of blackface, common at the time.

At once a tale of the Judaizing of American culture and an acknowledgment of the challenges to come, *Only in America* is a glistening examination of a man at the center of a watershed moment in the arts.

He is the author of several books, among them *China 1945*; A *Girl Named Faithful Plum*; *Ultimate Journey*, a *New York Times* Best Book of the Year; and *Out of the Blue*, named one of the seven best books of the year by *The Boston Globe*. 
Drawing on thousands of never-before-translated letters and unpublished sources, this biography reveals dramatic new information about the life and work of one of the late nineteenth century's most important painters. Despite being mocked at the beginning of his career, and living hand to mouth, Monet risked all to pursue his vision, and his early work along the banks of the Seine in the 1860s and '70s would come to be revered as Impressionism. In the following decades, he emerged as its celebrated leader in one of the most exciting cultural moments in Paris, before withdrawing to his house and garden to paint the late *Water Lilies*, which were ignored during his lifetime and would later have a major influence on all twentieth-century painters both figurative and abstract.

This is the first time we see the turbulent life of this volatile and voracious man, who was as obsessed by his love affairs as he was by nature. He changed his art decisively three times when the woman at the center of his life changed; Wullschläger brings these unknown, passionate, and passionately committed women to the foreground. Monet's closest friend was Prime Minister Georges Clemenceau; strong intellectual currents connected him to writers from Zola to Proust, as well as to his friends Manet, Renoir, and Pissarro. Brilliant and absorbing, this biography will forever change our understanding of Monet's life and work.

- MODERN TOUR DE FORCE: Monet's *Water Lilies* could easily be the work of a late 20th century painter. Barnett Newman, Ellsworth Kelly, Anish Kapoor, and Peter Doig are among the many artists influenced by him.
- **EXHIBITIONS:** Monet's work is on permanent display in many museums but particularly in the Museum of Modern Art, the Musée Marmottan-Monet, the Orangerie, the Musée d'Orsay, as well as his house and gardens in Giverny. 
