

American Oasis Finding the Future in the Cities of the Southwest Kyle Paoletta



An expansive and revelatory exploration of the multicultural, water-seeking, land-destroying settlers of Great Basin and Colorado Plateau throughout history, arguing that in order to know where America is going in the time of mass migration and climate change we must understand where the Southwest has been

Albuquerque. Phoenix. El Paso. Las Vegas. Iconic American cities surrounded by desert and rust. Teeming metropolises that seem to exist independently of the seemingly inhospitable and arid landscape that surrounds them, belying the rich insight they offer into American stories of migration, industry, bloodshed, and rebirth.

Charting a geographic path along the Great Basin and the Sonoran and Moajave deserts, acclaimed journalist Kyle Paoletta maps the past and future of these cities, and the many other settlements from rural town to urban sprawl that make up the region that has come to be called "the American Southwest." Weaving together the stories of immigrants and indigenous populations, American Oasis pulls back the layers of settlement, sediment, habit, and effect that successive empires have left on the region, from the Anasazi, Athapascan, Diné, Tewa, Apache, and Comanche, to the Spanish, Mexican, and, finally, American.

As Paoletta's journey into the Southwest's history becomes inextricably linked to an exploration of its dependency on water, he begins to ask: where, ultimately, will cities like Las Vegas and Phoenix find themselves once the Colorado River and its branches dry up? Richly reported and sweeping in its history, American Oasis is the story of what one iconic region's past can tell us about our shared environmental and culture future.

**DEFINITIVE HISTORY OF THE SOUTHWEST:** Many works of history and journalism focus on the "heartland" and on Texas specifically, but there has yet to be a work that examines the breadth and depth of the Southwest. Paoletta examines the successive groups—indigenous, colonial, and eventually, "American,"—that have shaped the region.

WINNING CATEGORY: American Oasis joins several recent books on US regional history and culture that have performed well and continued to backlist, including Forget the Alamo and God Save Texas.



### Over to You Letters Between a Father and Son John Berger and Yves Berger



Compelling and intimate, this collection of never-before-seen letters between the celebrated art critic and essayist, John Berger and his son Yves, an artist, is a moving look at their musings on art, memory, life, death, and beyond.

Written between 2015-16, with 53 color images of well-known old masters and contemporary art as well as some of the Bergers' own drawings and watercolors, *Over to You* is an informal back and forth not unlike the ping-pong games father and son used to play in the barn of their house. It begins when John—who is in a Parisian suburb—sends Yves—who is in Haute Savoie—an envelope of reproductions of art that have moved him. And so they begin to reveal their thoughts looking at a Goya, Watteau, Twombly, Joan Mitchell, Durer, Caravaggio, Manet, and Euan Uglow, among many others. But the art is just a way to summon shared emotions and memories, as well as deepen their understanding of the world and its mysteries.

John at 89 is the more formal teacher, Yves at 39 comes across as the younger, philosophical artist. There are John's thoughts on the use of color, light and space in, say, a Dürer, or a Beckmann to the question of "staying fully alive"; or Yves noting how much in life exceeds our understanding, the gap between our consciousness and our feeling, between the said and the unsaid. "That's the zone where I would like us to meet. Are you coming?" He asks his father. "I may need other eyes to confirm what is really there. Like your eyes always did." This is an exceptional and moving tribute to a relationship between a father and son, and between two artists, as well as a thought provoking look at questions we all have about work, time, the universe, life and death.

- BOOK OF LETTERS: In the age of tech, letters as we knew them may have changed, but the form has been given new life by recent works such as the reissue of Franz Kafka's letters and diaries, Kurt Vonnegut's selected letters, and Ta-Nehisi Coates's Between the World and Me, which sold over 1.3 million copies in the U.S. alone, in no small part due to its striking narrative immediacy. Over to You draws you in with its profound, universal insights.
- A MOVING TRIBUTE: Lovingly compiled by Berger's son, Yves, a few years after his father's death in 2017, this correspondence reflects Berger's as well as Yves' whimsical, but often profound observations on art, life, death, and memory.
- FULL-COLOR REPRODUCTIONS OF ICONIC WORKS: The text is rich with luminous and thought-provoking explorations of iconic works of art including Caravaggio's "The Conversion of Saint Paul" and Morandi's "Still Life." John Berger, well-known for his influential essay "Ways of Seeing," a commentary on the experience of viewing and perceiving, here shares insights that will appeal to those compelled by his legacy of thought.
- **GIFT BOOK:** These moving and playful letters about art and life between a father and son are accompanied by 53 full-color images from old masters and contemporary artists and the Bergers' own drawings, making it the perfect gift book.

**YVES BERGER** is an artist and the author of essays and books of poems. In 2018, his exhibition, "From the Orchard to the Garden" was shown in Madrid. He lives in a small mountain village in the French Alps.

**JOHN BERGER** is the author of eight novels, four plays, two books of poetry, and fifty-two books of nonfiction. An English art critic, novelist, painter and poet, his novel *G.* won the 1972 Booker Prize and his essay "Ways of Seeing" was a vastly influential work that continues to inform our thoughts on the visual experience. He died in 2017.

Wells, Jack London, W.B. Yeats and J.G. Ballard to The Twilight Zone, Dr. Strangelove, Mad Max and The Terminator.

- A MOST TIMELY SUBJECT: Lynskey writes how we are in a moment when the danger of climate crisis is joined by "the new fear of another global pandemic and the old spectre of nuclear war." Yet, as he shows us the history of apocalyptic ideas, we realize each generation thought they would be the one to witness the end.
- A FRESH TAKE: Highly readable, Lynskey's book is full of fascinating references to fiction and film. Most previous studies of apocalyptic fiction are academic and out of print. Recently, Mark O'Connell's Notes on the Apocalypse (2020) is more reporting, rather than history and with little reference to literature; Niall Ferguson's Doom: The Politics of Catastrophe (2021) is focused on politics rather than art.

- WELL-CONNECTED IN THE MEDIA: Lynskey is a cohost of a popular podcast in the UK called Origin Story with a huge following. He is well-known in media circles.

DORIAN LYNSKEY is the author of 33 Revolutions Per Minute: A History of Protest Songs (2011) and The Ministry of Truth: A Biography of George Orwell's 1984 (2019). His writing on music, film, books, and politics has appeared in various publications including The Guardian, The New Statesman, The Spectator, BBC Culture, The Los Angeles Times and Slate.

# Outraged Why We Fight About Morality and Politics Kurt Gray



A new framework for the moral mind that completely rewrites our understanding of where moral judgments come from and how we can overcome the feelings of outrage that so often divide us

For a very long time, humans were considered "killer apes," apex predators. But when you're standing alone in the forest, do you feel strong, ready to take on anything? Or do you feel vulnerable to every sound and movement? Chances are, it's the latter. We descend from a long line of hominids who were prey at least as often as they were predator. Our minds are hard-wired to perceive threats in the world around us, and we are quick to react. And this realization about our ancestors has profound implications for our moral psychology and why it is so easy to feel outraged.

The received wisdom in moral psycology divides morality into different pillars, but Gray's grand unifying theory is that all morality stems from our perception of threat and harm, and who's being harmed in a given situation. It explains why we overreact to everything from minor irritations to perceived threats. It can also help explain why you're a Democrat or Republican and how each side sees the world differently. In all cases, moral outrage is the result of seeing someone acting in a way that causes harm, whether to ourselves, to those we care about, or to society.

Outraged presents a fascinating, groundbreaking new view on moral conflict that explores why harm is so central to morality, why and how people disagree about perceptions of harm, and how understanding this fundamental principle can help us bridge moral divides.

- A FASCINATING NEW THEORY: Moral foundations theory, which has been the dominant school of thought in moral psychology as exemplified by Jonathan Haidt's THE RIGHTEOUS MIND, is crumbling. While Haidt believed in fundamental differences between liberals and conservatives, Kurt Gray's research has been instrumental in showing that those differences don't really exist.
- HOPE FOR THE POLITICAL MOMENT: The outrage of the culture wars has brought political divisiveness to a fever pitch. Kurt Gray's new theory of the moral mind is bringing cutting edge science to bear on the question of how to develop moral understanding and heal.
- LESSONS FOR YOUR OWN LIFE: Not only does Kurt Gray's research shed light on the plight of our political discourse, it also helps us better understand our own feelings of outrage and connect better with others through vulnerability.
- PREVIOUS BOOK: Kurt Gray was the co-author with his mentor of THE MIND CLUB, which didn't have as much topical appeal as OURTRAGED. Now Gray is stepping out from behind his mentor's shadow and putting forth a bold new theory that radically upsets the received wisdom on moral psychology.

KURT GRAY is a Professor in Psychology and Neuroscience at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where he directs the Deepest Beliefs Lab and the Center for the Science of Moral Understanding. He is also an Adjunct Professor in Organizational Behavior at the Kenan-Flagler Business School at UNC, where he teaches about organizational ethics and team processes. Dr. Gray received his PhD from Harvard University.

## Health and Safety t/c Emily Witt

In the summer of 2016, a divisive presidential election was underway, and a new breed of right-wing rage was on the rise. Emily Witt, who would soon publish her first book on sex in the digital age, had recently quit antidepressants for a more expansive world of psychedelic experimentation. From her apartment in Brooklyn, she began to catch glimpses of the clandestine nightlife scene thrumming around her.

In Health and Safety, Witt charts her immersion into New York City's dance music underground. Emily would come to lead a double life. By day she worked as a journalist, covering gun violence, climate catastrophes, and the rallies of right-wing militias. And by night she pushed the limits of consciousness in hollowed-out office spaces and warehouses to music that sounded like the future. But no counterculture, no matter how utopian, could stave off the squalor of American politics and the cataclysm of 2020.


Affectionate yet never sentimental, Health and Safety is a lament for a broken relationship, for a changed nightlife scene, and for New York City just before the fall. Sparing no one—least of all herself—Witt offers her life as a lens onto an era of American delirium and dissolution.

She is the author of the books Future Sex and Nollywood. Her journalism, essays, and criticism have appeared in n+1, the Times, GQ, Harper's, and the London Review of Books, and have been anthologized in The Best American Travel Writing 2011, Say What You Mean: the n+1 Anthology, and Meeting the Devil: A Book of Memoir from the London Review of Books.




In this fresh take on love and trouble in America, Brock Hobson, an insurance salesman and Sunday-school teacher, finds his equilibrium disturbed by the results of a predictive blood test. Baxter, a master storyteller, brings us a gradually building rollercoaster narrative, and a protagonist who is impertinent, searching, and hilariously relatable. From his good-as-gold, gentle girlfriend to the excessively macho subcontractor guy his ex-wife left him for, not to mention his well-raised teenage kids, now exploring sex and sexuality, the secondary characters in Brock's life all contribute meaningfully to the drama, as increasing challenges to his sense of self and purpose crash over him. The final battle—no spoilers, but there is one—couldn't be more delightful, as this quick and bracing novel reminds us to choose the best people to love, accept the ones we love even if we didn't choose them, and love them all well.

### **Defectors**



### Paola Ramos

An award-winning journalist's deeply reported exploration of how race, identity and political trauma have influenced the rise in far-right sentiment among Latinos, and how this group can shape American politics

Democrats have historically assumed they can rely on the Latino vote, but recent elections have called that loyalty into question. In fact, despite his vociferous anti-immigrant rhetoric and disastrous border policies, Trump won a higher percentage of the Latino vote in 2020 than he did in 2016. Now, journalist Paola Ramos pulls back the curtain on these voters, traveling around the country to uncover what motivates them to vote for and support issues that seem so at odds with their self-interest.

From coast to coast, cities to rural towns, Defectors introduces readers to underdog GOP candidates, January 6th insurrectionists, Evangelical pastors and culture war crusaders, aiming to identify the influences at the heart of this rightward shift. Through their stories, Ramos shows how tribalism, traditionalism, and political trauma within the Latino community has been weaponized to radicalize and convert voters who, like many of their white counterparts, are fearful of losing their place in American society.

We meet Monica de la Cruz, a Republican congresswoman from the Rio Grande Valley who won on a platform centered on finishing "what Donald Trump started" and pushing the Great Replacement Theory; David Ortiz, a Mexican man who refers to himself as a Spaniard and opposed the removal of a statue of a Spanish conquistador in New Mexico; Luis Cabrera, an evangelical pastor pushing to "Make America Godly Again;" Anthony Aguero, an independent journalist turned border vigilante; and countless other individuals and communities that make up the rising conservative Latino population. Cross-cultural and assiduously reported, Defectors highlights how one of America's most powerful and misunderstood electorates may come to define the future of American politics.

- RIPE FOR ELECTION YEAR: After 2020 exposed the ways in which Democratic politicians had taken the Latino voter base for granted, Ramos's book will publish into a news cycle in which the issues she discusses are front and center.
- DEFINITIVE PROFILE OF A TOPIC: While several books explore rising farright sentiment in America, Ramos's is one of few to specifically look at the unique structures and systems that have influenced its rise among America's Latino population. She blends history, cross-cultural reporting, and political theory to offer a definitive and rigorous look at this issue.
- AWARD-WINNING JOURNALIST: Ramos has been awarded an Emmy and a GLAAD award, among others, for her journalism. Her previous book—a more general profile of Latinx identity in the US—was critically acclaimed, called "long-overdue" (Ms. Magazine) and praised for its "candor and empathy"





FRANZ KAFKA was born in 1883 in Prague, where he lived most of his life. During his lifetime, he published only a few short stories, including "The Metamorphosis," "The Judgment," and "The Stoker." He died in 1924, before completing any of his full-length novels. At the end of his life, Kafka asked his lifelong friend and literary executor Max Brod to burn all his unpublished work. Brod overrode those wishes.

ROSS BENJAMIN's translations include Friedrich Hölderlin's Hyperion, Joseph Roth's Job, and Daniel Kehlmann's You Should Have Left and Tyll. He was awarded the 2010 Helen and Kurt Wolff Translator's Prize for his rendering of Michael Maar's Speak, Nabokov, and he received a Guggenheim fellowship for his work on Franz Kafka's diaries.





### No Road Leading Back





This by turns shattering and hope-giving account of prisoners who dug their way to freedom from the Nazis is both a stunning escape narrative and an object lesson in the ways we remember and continually forget the particulars of the Holocaust.

No Road Leading Back is the remarkable story of a dozen prisoners who escaped from the site where more than 70,000 Jews were shot in the Lithuanian forest of Ponar after the Nazi invasion of Eastern Europe in 1941. Anxious to hide the incriminating evidence of the murders, the S.S. later in the war enslaved a group of Jews to exhume every one of the bodies and incinerate them all in a months-long labor—an episode whose specifics are staggering and disturbing, even within the context of the Holocaust. From within that dire circumstance emerges the improbable escape made by some of the men, who dug a tunnel with bare hands and spoons while they were trapped and quarded day and night—an act not just of bravery and desperation but of awesome imagination. Based on first-person accounts of the escapees and on each scrap of evidence that has been documented, repressed, or amplified since, this book resurrects their lives, while also providing a complex, urgent analysis of why their story has rarely been told, and never accurately. Heath explores the cultural use and misuse of Holocaust testimony and the need for us to face it—and all uncomfortable historical truths—with honesty and accuracy.

- HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE: This relatively unknown Holocaust material and Heath's accessible yet eye-opening approach to it will attract the general reader in addition to scholars and students of the period.
- CHARACTER-DRIVEN ESCAPE NARRATIVE: The story of the escape tunnel and the fact that a dozen men survived their torture and imprisonment gives this narrative a propulsive force and attraction for the reader, as we get to know all the men, both how they survived the war and their post-war journeys.
- CONTRIBUTION TO HOLOCAUST STUDIES: Heath's careful observation of the truths and untruths perpetrated around this narrative (some purposeful, others not) and his conclusions about the implications for our understandings of the Holocaust over time make the book a powerful contribution to this field. No Road should draw major review attention.
- EXPANDS ON A VIRAL NEWS STORY: In 2016, the New York Times published "Escape Tunnel, Dug by Hand, Is Found at Holocaust Massacre Site." They reported on the archeological discovery at Ponar and soon other outlets picked up on the news. Sensing a larger complex story behind the tunnel and its discovery, Heath has spent years researching the events that happened at Ponar during the war and the narratives about the site.

Award-winning journalist CHRIS HEATH has written about a wide array of subjects for GQ, The Atlantic, Esquire and Vanity Fair. His story "18 Tigers, 17 Lions, 8 Bears, 3 Cougars, 2 Wolves, 1 Baboon, 1 Macaque, and 1 Man Dead in Ohio." won the 2013 National Magazine Award for Reporting; his story "The Militiamen, the Governor and the Kidnapping That Wasn't" was nominated for the 2023 National Magazine Award for Feature Writing. He has also written about popular culture, including the books Pet Shop Boys, Literally and the 2004 UK bestseller Feel, about British pop star Robbie Williams. He co-wrote the lyrics for the Royal Shakespeare Company's The Boy in the Dress, which premiered in Stratford in November 2019. Based in Brooklyn, Heath grew up south of Birmingham in the United Kingdom.

### Giant Love





A book that explores the great American novelist and playwright Edna Ferber, winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Ficton, whose work was made into many Academy Award-winning movies; the writing of her controversial, international best-selling novel about Texas, and the making of George Stevens' Academy Award winning epic film of the same name, Giant.

The stupendous publication of Edna Ferber's Giant in 1952 set off a storm of protest over the novel's portrayal of Texas manners, money and mores with oil-rich Texans threatening to shoot, lynch or ban Ferber from ever entering the state again.

In Giant Love, Julie Gilbert writes of the internationally best-selling Ferber, one of the most widely read writers in the first half of the 20th Century - her evolution from mid-west maverick girl-reporter to Pulitzer Prize winning, beloved American novelist, from her want-to-be actress days to becoming Broadway's acclaimed prize-winning playwright whose collaborators - George S. Kauffman and Moss Hart, among them, were, along with Ferber, herself, the most successful playwrights of their time.

Here is the making of an American classic novel and the film that followed in its wake. We see how George Stevens, Academy-Award winning director, wooed the prickly, stubborn Ferber, ultimately getting her to agree to everything including writing, for the first time ever, a draft of a screenplay, to her okaying James Dean for the part of the ranch hand, Jett Rink, something she was dead set against.

Here is the casting of Elizabeth Taylor, Rock Hudson, James Dean and their backstory triangle of sex and seduction - each becoming a huge star because of the film; the frustrated Stevens trying to direct the instinctive but undisciplined Dean, and the months long landmark filming in the sleepy town of Marfa, Texas, suddenly invaded by a battalion of a film crew and some of the biggest stars in the rising celebrity culture.

- THERE ARE VAST ADMIRERS OF THE GEORGE STEVENS' EPIC, GIANT, MADE IN 1956. The picture made \$35 million \$400 million today in ticket sales during its original studio release in 1956. The movie is shown on TCM at least once a month and has been for the past decade.
- LEGENDS, TALES AND MISADVENTURES ARE ASSOCIATED WITH THE PICTURE AND ENDLESS CURIOSITY ABOUT THE MOVIE AND THE MAKING OF IT. Two recent documentaries on the making of the picture, RETURN TO GIANT, was made in 2022, almost seven decades after the original release of the film. And THE CHILDREN OF GIANT (2015).
- THE AUTHOR HAS MADE USE OF NEVER BEFORE SEEN MATERIAL PRESUMED LOST. Edna Ferber's files on GIANT from her own archives letters, diaries, journals, ledgers, photographs, and new details of the making of the picture have only recently been rediscovered.
- THE CONTINUING ALLURE SURROUNDING THE TOWN OF MARFA, TEXAS, where the novel was set and where the picture was shot in the summer of 1955.
- WITH THE PUBLICATION OF GILBERT'S BOOK, THERE WILL BE RENEWED INTEREST IN EDNA'S FERBER'S NOVELS. The time is right for a rediscovery of Ferber. Ferber celebrated American life in novels, short stories and plays through strong, independent woman who fought convention as well as racism and sexism. Ferber was dismissed by male critics, scorned for being Jewish, a woman, and unmarried but she was one of the most widely read writers in the first half of the 20th Century.
- THE UNTOLD STORY OF HOW EDNA FERBER, WINNER OF THE PULITZER PRIZE, CAME TO WRITE THIS EPIC NOVEL THAT TOOK ON THE ULTRA-RICH OF TEXAS, its controversial publication and the twisted tale of its purchase for

the movies.

JULIE GILBERT was born in New York City and was educated at Boston University. She is the author of four books, among them a biography of her great aunt, Edna Ferber, Edna Ferber and Her Circle and Opposite Attraction: The Lives of Erich Maria Remarque and Paulette Goddard, Gilbert is a member of The Dramatists Guild, The Writers Guild of America, East, The Authors Guild, Actors' Equity, and League of Professional Theater Women. She has taught Creative Writing at New York University's School of Continuing Education and currently heads The Writers Academy at The Kravis Center for the Performing Arts in West Palm Beach, Florida where she lives part time, as well as in New York City.
